

#### Springtime in the Clubhouse

celebrating Women's History Month, the Clubhouses are abuzz with springtime excitement.

The STEM lab was filled with "wow!" "eek!" and "no way!" as members dissected owl pellets - the undigested parts of an owl's food that are regurgitated, typically presenting as little balls filled with fur and bones. Future biologists and beauticians alike examined the pellets and their contents, reconstructing the skeletons of past prey. It was a fabulous experience for all, teaching patience, skill with tweezers, close-up identification and general ornithological knowledge.





Over in the classroom, Explorers and Juniors have been learning about democracy and participating in Quarterly Clubhouse Elections. As both candidates and voters, members campaigned and listened to their peers share why they should be elected. Explorers Garby, Nickolas, Noah and Odin ran for president and vice president of the Explorers. Taking critical questions from their peers, each made their case. Noah shared he would help his peers by showing his method, to those who don't know how, to tie his shoes. Garby, the current president, argued for his re-election, saying he could lobby for resources such as pencils. Nick said he would provide unity among grades, promoting collective activities for grades two through four. And Odin, whose campaign was fervently supported by his little sister, said: "I will cheer you up when you're feeling down and make you feel less lonely."



Once elected, member leaders have biweekly meetings with Clubhouse staff to share input on programming and overall morale and to pitch ideas for activities and field trips. Our teen campuses also have elected member officials, but per the teens' decision, teen officials are elected annually and serve for a full year. We are immensely proud of all our members who have campaigned and participated by using their voices and votes. By electing their peers, our members are taking ownership of the Clubhouse and ensuring that every voice is heard.

In honor of Women's History Month and International Women's Day, our Clubhouses held empowerment sessions at which members were encouraged to share their stories and uplift their peers. Explorers, Juniors and teens participated in activities and games where they learned about trailblazing women who have fought for human rights.

We are immensely grateful for the opportunity to continue educating our members on social justice issues, to encourage them to always ask questions and to help them build their self-esteem and self-image.
